VIDEO - THIS COP'S "GUN"

Sergeant Toby Hinton — beat cop, producer/director, judo instructor, lecturer and cofounder of Odd Squad Productions (OSP) will be speaker at the first meeting of the new year on Tuesday 2 January.

His work on the Vancouver Police Department's (VPD) Drug Education and Enforcement Team as well as leadership in "The Odd Squad Productions", a non-profit charitable organization dedicated to drug education for youth, have earned him numerous awards and kudos.

These include: the Order of Merit for Policing in Canada (only 44 awarded across the country), three Lieutenant Governor Awards, the BC Attorney General's Community Crime Prevention Award, as well as a number of Commendations from senior officers within the VPD.

In 2011, Toby was nominated for *Policeman of the Year Award* at the International Association of Chiefs of Police annual conference in Chicago. Receiving an Honorable Mention, he was the first nominee from outside the USA.

Toby often uses his off-duty time to deliver presentations to schools and communities around BC, the Yukon and, recently, in the NWT in cooperation with the RCMP. These presentations use the reality videos produced by OSP (more overleaf), to deliver the message.

We are very fortunate to have the opportunity to hear Toby speak about the Odd Squad drug education and policing in Vancouver's Down Town East Side (DTES)

ODD SQUAD DON'T MISS A BEAT REALITY IN DRUG EDUCATION



There's a relatively quiet group of men and women on the Vancouver Police Force who, not only walk their beat but spend time behind and in front of the camera. The Odd Squad Productions (OSP) make award winning videos that help kids, parents and professionals across North America understand the way of the streets - in particular those of Vancou-



ver Down Town East Side.

These videos wrench at your heart and leave you with a greater understanding of the widespread effect of drug abuse. The stark and often disturbing images and interviews with those who live (and often die) in the back streets and alleys that most of us try to avoid makes it clear that they are people just like us. They have, simply put, at some point in their young lives made the wrong decision and followed a downward path.

These are the messages that Toby and his colleagues give to teens about drug abuse and addiction—using the words of the addicts and dealers themselves. Not only does video bring home the message more meaningfully than any talking head at a podium could—it also provides a platform for addicts to talk directly to the kids. Toby has stated that the squad easily finds willing

participants for the videos in the streets of the East Side. Most who are there want to warn their contemporaries away from their own life of misery.

Go to the OSP website to see such videos as <u>Tears for</u>

<u>April</u>, the story of a 17 year old whose short life on the street is told by a beat cop who first warned her of the dangers of the street and, ultimately, found her dead on Christmas Day.

Come on Wednesday to meet Toby and learn much more about the Odd Squad.
