#### KEEPING THE LIGHTS ON

When people turn on the light switch most don't think about where and how that electricity arrived. All they mainly care about is that the light switch comes on.

At our *Friday October 4th* meeting meeting BC Hydro's
Stephen Watson will provide an overview of the Vancouver Island electricity grid (including our local grid) and how they keep the power on, despite its advancing age. Much of the system was built in the 1950's and in need of upgrades to the infrastructure in order to keep up with consumer demand.

A Nanoose Bay resident and champion amateur golfer, Stephen was born in Nanaimo and attended university in the U.S. on a golf scholarship. He has worked for BC Hydro for 22 years, obtaining his Masters of

Science degree in community and regional land use planning at UBC in the 1990s.

Stephen will discuss the billion dollar John Hart Generating Station Replacement Project in Campbell River, the \$30 million Buckley Bay Substation Project near Courtenay, and the \$52 million Long Beach Area Reinforcement Project near
Ucluelet. He will also illustrate
how BC Hydro respects environmental social considerations in
its operations through the
Heber River Diversion Decom-

missioning Project near Gold

During the open enrolment period, Probus members under the age of 75 can apply for Ex-



tended Health Care coverage without providing medical evidence of insurability. Also, Dental Care applications received during the open enrolment period will not be subject to proration of annual limits.

Following the open enrolment period, new Probus members may apply for this coverage within 60 days of losing existing employer group coverage without submitting medical evidence for eligibility. After 60 days, EHC with Prestige Travel applications require medical evidence of insurability and may be declined coverage.
